### UBC CAMPAIGN LAUNCH FEATURES THE NGDI AND KISH WASAN

The University of British Columbia has launched an ambitious \$1.5 billion fundraising campaign with a twin goal of doubling the number of alumni engaged in the life of the university by 2015. The campaign, named start an evolution, is the largest fundraising campaign in Canadian university history and was launched in Vancouver today with a campus celebration. UBC's campus in the Okanagan aims to raise \$100 million and double its own alumni participation levels as part of the overall UBC campaign goals.

After viewing a short promotional piece for the NGDI and Kish's <u>Oral AmpB project</u>, Kish told the audience the story of discovering neglected diseases through a serendipitous conversation with a <u>Universities Allied for Essential Medicines</u> student. He ended with a call for students to take up the work on neglected diseases, "My generation isn't going to solve them all, your generation is", he stated.

The Neglected Global Diseases Initiative is a priority project for funding with the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences under their international engagement section.

Teaching Surgery in Kabul, Afghanistan Today's Challenge & Wider Implications

**Presenter: Dr Ken Foster** 

Born and raised as a third generation missionary kid in Zambia, Dr Ken Foster completed his surgical training at the University of Western Ontario in 1988. His surgical training includes a hand and upper limb center fellowship at the University of Western Ontario and a clinical scholarship with UBC Plastics. His commitment to Afghanistan began in 1997 where he worked in Kabul's main orthopedic hospital and the ICRC trauma hospital. Between 2003-05 he worked in Mazar, returning to Kabul in 2007 where he has been teaching surgery for the past three and half years. He has also worked in Angola, Thailand and Yemen. In 2010 he was awarded the Teasdale-Corti humanitarian service award by the Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons of Canada. Dr Foster likes to "focus on the conviction that it is not a matter of giving skills or knowledge to individuals but of establishing and promoting a learning community that encourages reflexive learning".

He is a Professor at Dalla Lana School of Public Health and of Surgery at the University of Toronto, and Director of Ethics and Commercialization at the McLaughlin-Rotman Centre for Global Health. He is the recipient of the UNESCO Avicenna Prize for Ethics of Science, and often advises governments and the UN, UNESCO, WHO and OECD on global health.

PETER SINGER is Director of the McLaughlin-Rotman Centre for Global Health, Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto and CEO of Grand Challenges Canada. He has advised the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the UN Secretary-General's Office, the Government of Canada, and Pepsico Inc. He is also a sought-after commentator and public speaker. Singer was appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada in 2011 for his contributions to health research and bioethics, and for his dedication to improving the health of people in developing countries.
