NGDI Member Dr. Mark Ansermino Phone Based Pulse Oximeter Software Launched

UBC spin-off company <u>Lionsgate Technologies Inc.</u> is preparing to launch a software application — developed by two UBC professors — that transforms smartphones, tablets and laptops into mobile medical diagnostic tools capable of real-time vital signs monitoring.

Using standard medical sensors connected directly through the universal audio port of virtually any mobile device, the proprietary interface, called the Vital Signs DSP (Digital Signal Processor), provides precise monitoring of blood oxygen levels, blood pressure and body temperature which are displayed on the mobile device's monitor.



The availability of an accurate, affordable mobile medical diagnostic tool has sweeping applications in the medical/clinical and consumer markets as well as in the developing world, where 64 per cent of mobile phone users are found. <<u>read more</u>>

iCo Therapeutics Oral AmpB Presented at AAPS with Updated Patent Position

iCo Therapeutics Inc. presented its oral Amphotericin B (Amp B) delivery system in five poster presentations at the 2012 AAPS Annual Meeting and Exposition, on October 14 – 18, 2012 at McCormick Place, Chicago Illinois.



The Amp B program also announced a new patent in Singapore, providing additional patent protection. "The Amp B program has been primarily financed with roughly two million dollars in grant money committed to date and is a great source of pride at iCo," said Andrew Rae, President and CEO of iCo Therapeutics. "Our growing IP

position strengthens our belief in the asset and we're very excited to see it get highlighted through five posters at AAPS."

iCo Therapeutics is testing a novel oral delivery method for Amp B, an anti-fungal medication, recognized as the gold standard for the treatment of systemic fungal infection. This formulation was developed in the laboratory of Dr. Kishor M. Wasan, Professor and Associate Dean of Research in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at the University of British Columbia. Until now, the drug has only been available through intravenous administration and has faced challenges due to toxicity.

(Available to Canadian Scholars and senior professionals who want to lecture and/or do research in the United States during the 2011-2012 academic year)

Traditional Awards – for scholars & PDocs (Canadian citizens only) to conduct research and/or teach for one semester or full academic year at a University of research centre of their choice in the U.S. Not available for summer months only. Value: \$25K for 9 months or \$12.5K for one semester + health insurance. Faculty sabbatical, leave of absence or retirement pay <u>may be used concurrently</u> with Fulbright support.

Visiting Research Chairs – for scholars and experienced professionals to research/develop collaborations/guest lecture at select American universities and research centres, normally for one semester. See website for range of opportunities. Value: ~\$25K for one semester + health insurance + Fulbright enrichment opportunities. A few chairs are open, but most are targeted, including: Canadian or North American Studies, Canada-US Relations/Transborder Studies, Innovation, Military Social Work, Policy Studies, Public Diplomacy, Quebec Studies, Science (Energy, Environment, Health Medicine), War & Peace.

ISTPCanada and CIHR announce Canada-China Joint Initiative

Pre-announcement of upcoming call for proposals on Human Vaccine Research and Development

Background: The Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) and the International Science and Technology Partnerships Canada (ISTPCanada) in partnership with the Ministry of Science and Technology (MOST) of the People's Republic of China are in the process of establishing a joint funding opportunity to fund industrial-academia collaborative research and development (R&D) in the area of vaccines against infectious diseases in humans. The focus of this initiative will be on the translation of innovations with high potential for downstream commercialization that will bring economic and social benefits to Canada and China.

Research Areas: The scope of this initiative will encompass basic and clinical health research which may also include health services research and population health research in the field of vaccines against infectious diseases in humans. Although not exclusive, applications in the following area will be encouraged:

- Approaches and optimized techniques used for polysaccharide protein conjugate vaccines
- Studies of novel vaccine adjuvants and delivery systems

- Mucosal immunology and mechanistic studies for vaccine development
- Influenza and existing and emerging viruses
- Bioprocessing and production

Who is Eligible? This funding opportunity will support vaccine R&D projects involving Canadian researchers from both academia <u>and</u> industry in collaboration with Chinese academic <u>and</u> industry partners.

Patents and Politics - How the HIV crisis changed pharmaceutical intellectual property policies

Ellen 't Hoen is a lawyer and an independent consultant in medicines policy and law, with expertise in intellectual property and access to medicines. She established the Medicines Patent Pool to accelerate the availability of low cost HIV treatments in developing countries through patent licensing, and was its executive

Director until June 2012. Ellen 't Hoen is a member of the World Health Organizations Expert Advisory Panel on Drug Policies and Management, and a research fellow at the IS HIV/AIDS Academy of the University of Amsterdam. She is the author of the book: "The Global Politics of Pharmaceutical Monopoly Power. Drug patents, access, innovation and the application of the WTO Doha Declaration on TRIPS and Public Health," published in 2009. She also co-founded DES Action the Netherlands and has won several awards for her work on DES (Diethylstilbestrol).

The Geopolitics of Neglected Tropical Diseases - PLOS Collections ...

To commemorate the Fifth Anniversary of the launch of *PLOS Neglected Tropical Diseases*, we are releasing a collection focusing on geographic perspectives on the global burden of the neglected tropical diseases. In the following statement, *PLOS Neglected Tropical Diseases* Editor-in-Chief Peter Hotez describes the collection:

"Among the unique aspects of the NTDs is their intimate link with poverty and their marked geographic and regional variation. Since the very beginning of *PLOS Neglected Tropical Diseases*, together with colleagues I have written and submitted a series of papers that try to summarize the major NTDs endemic to a particular geographic region and the key published data for those conditions, with an emphasis on their distribution, prevalence, and disease burden. Many of these papers were written with colleagues from the actual region. The first papers along a geographic theme began in 2008 with the Latin American and Caribbean region, in addition to closer looks at Brazil, the Caribbean region, and the United States of America. In 2009 we summarized sub-Saharan Africa and the nations of the Organisation of the Islamic Conference; in 2010 nuclear weapons states, the "Post-American" world, and the Canadian Arctic; in 2011 South Asia, Central Asia and NTDs in the Catholic world; in 2012, the Middle East and North Africa, and also Nigeria. Next year we anticipate publishing a summary of Oceania. We hope this collection of papers will be useful for those interested in a particular part. We also hope the collection will inspire people to think about our global diversity of people and their NTDs."

"Fighting Neglect" charts Doctors Without Borders/Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF)'s 25 years of experience in diagnosing and treating <u>Chagas disease</u>, <u>sleeping sickness</u>, and <u>Kala Azar</u> in Latin America, Sub-Saharan Africa, South Asia, and the Caucasus.

It examines past, present, and future management of the diseases and shows that treatment is possible even with existing diagnostic tools and medicines. However, additional research and development toward new and more effective diagnostics and treatments are desperately needed to address the overwhelming neglect of people whose



needs are not met by pharmaceutical companies.

It will take increased political will among international donors and national governments where these diseases are endemic to improve access to quality lifesaving treatment.
